These include a scenic narrated tour of Newport with a tour of the Breakers mansion and Colonial walking tour with lunch at the White Horse Tavern.

Scenic Narrated Tour of Newport with Tour of the Breakers Mansion: The narrated tour will include the colonial section, the world-famous ten-mile Ocean Drive, and Bellevue Avenue, where you will find the most magnificent collection of "summer cottages" in the country. You will then tour the famous Breakers Mansion, Newport's most palatial summer residence, built for Cornelius Vanderbilt, with a spectacular view overlooking the Atlantic Ocean.

Colonial Walking Tour, Lunch at White Horse Tavern, and Harbor Cruise: Newport is filled with historic architecture and revolutionary memorabilia. A stop will be made at the Hunter House, which was built in 1743. Lunch will be served at the White Horse Tavern, the oldest continually operating tavern in the Americas. After lunch, the group will be escorted to the boat dock for a narrated cruise of the harbor. After the one-hour cruise, you can browse in the boutiques along the waterfront.
